**RE: TWINE MILL AND DANE PERKINS IMPOUNDMENT DRAWDOWN
SCHEDULED FOR OCTOBER 27, 2017 THROUGH NOVEMBER 1, 2017**

Dear KLPD Customers and Interested Parties,

Please be advised that KLPD will be required to draw down the impoundment above Twine Mill Dam by approximately 5-6 feet for an inspection of the base of the Dane Perkins Dam. This means that the water level upstream of Twine Mill Dam, which is downstream of Dane Perkins Dam, will be most affected.

In order to facilitate the necessary inspection, the impoundment levels above Dane Perkins Dam will be minimally affected. It is anticipated the reduction of the Dane Perkins impoundment will be less than one foot.

Impacts to the Kesslen impoundment (Kesslen Dam to Twine Mill) are anticipated to be negligible, with some fluctuation to occur during the recharge of the Twine Mill impoundment post-inspection.

The drawdown will begin on Thursday, October 27 in anticipation of the inspection which will be completed on November 1, 2017. It is anticipated that the inspection will be completed in one day. KLPD will restore the Twine Mill impoundment level as weather and water flow permit.

The Kennebunk Light & Power District (KLPD) will be undertaking an inspection of the Dane Perkins Dam. The inspection will focus on the downstream side of the dam and has been identified as necessary based on the results of the underwater inspection completed earlier this year by Waterworks Diving, Inc. Because the impoundment associated with the Twine Mill Dam can influence water depths at the toe of the Dane Perkins Dam, we anticipate lowering of the impoundment above the Twine Mill Dam as well. We do not expect that the Twine Mill impoundment will be lowered by more than 5 to 6 feet below the dam crest. We anticipate that the inspection can be completed in one day.
